
Long Term Care

SDOH – The Beginnings





- Pilot at a small outpatient location from December 2019 –
 September 2020
- Screening questions covered the domains of Food Insecurity, Housing, Household Hazards and Utilities, and Transportation – Modeled from AHC Health-Related Social Needs Screening Tool
- Adapted as a result of Covid-19 in March 2020
- Inpatient and Long Term Care Screenings Commenced in April 2020
- Remaining Outpatient Locations were onboarded in 2021 and 2022

SDOH Today





- At Children's Specialized Hospital, SDOH programming was built into routine clinical care across all service lines – inpatient, outpatient, long term care, and early intervention
- All families who identify a need are provided resources after screen
- Internationally-recognized program for Patient and Family-Centered
