Improve Children's Access to Care

Increase funding for CHGME to \$718.8 million for FY 2023

The future of children's health in our nation is directly tied to the strength of our pediatric workforce. The gap between the federal investment in the Children's Hospitals Graduate Medical Education (CHGME) program—which supports the training of pediatricians at children's hospitals—and the support provided through Medicare graduate medical education (GME) to general acute care hospitals is contributing to worsening pediatric workforce shortages. Without action, an access-to-care crisis for children becomes worse.


Children's hospitals ask Congress to provide \$718.8 million for CHGME in FY 2023

Funding CHGME at **\$718.8 million for FY 2023** is the critical step needed to help children's hospitals sustain their teaching missions and create a strong pediatric workforce pipeline to care for children. The **CHGME** program, created 20 years ago, is our most vital national investment in strengthening the pediatric workforce and expanding timely access to care for children in communities large and small.

- It supports the training of half the nation's pediatricians and the majority of pediatric specialists.
- It represents just 2% of total federal spending on graduate medical education (GME).

We are at risk of falling further behind on children's health. Workforce shortages persist, most acutely among pediatric specialties such as child and adolescent psychiatry, developmental pediatrics and pediatric genetics and genomics. Alarmingly, federal funding for CHGME training programs:

- Is only about half of the federal funding the Medicare GME program receives—\$79,813 per pediatric resident compared to \$156,128 per resident trained with support from Medicare GME.
- Will decline to 46% of Medicare GME by 2026 if action is not taken.
